I was looking at the overloaded bookshelves debating what, if any, I could part with. Among the children's books were a set of the Narnia stories by C.S.Lewis. (My favourite was, 'The Horse and His Boy.') I remembered how much I had loved the stories.

"The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe' was the first book written (though not the first in the series.) Lewis wrote it for his goddaughter, Lucy. In the front of the book he noted that by the time he finished it she might be, 'too old for fairy tales.' He continued ...

... But some day you will be old enough to start reading fairy tales again. You can then take it down from some upper shelf, dust it, and tell me what you think of it.'

I decided that I was now 'old enough, 'to start reading fairy tales again,' and was very easily transported to another time and a fantastical place.

C.S. Lewis was a devout Christian. One can be in no doubt of this as the books are full of Biblical themes such as love,
forgiveness and redemption. Aslan, the wonderful Lion brings
Narnia into being (the tale told in, 'The Magician's Nephew,')
and he is there at its end (the tale told in, 'The Last Battle.')

When I first read the books I was transfixed by the characters, particularly the talking animals and the triumph of good over evil. Reading them again and having a little more knowledge of the Bible now, gave me a greater insight into the subtleties and nuances that I had not really grasped before.

Perhaps I need to investigate the children's books on my shelf more closely to see what else I can learn.

An Elder Writes......

During June and July, the United Reformed Church and the Council for World Mission Europe Region have hosted a 'Face to Face' learning programme for an international group of theology students to deepen their insights and understanding on issues of migration and human trafficking.

The National Synod of Wales was thrilled to be hosting two students - Samuel Phiri (from Zambia) and Joshua Immanuel (from South India) - for four weeks, based in Penrhys, Pontypridd and Cardiff. Below are Samuel's reflections following his 2 weeks in Penrhys and Pontypridd. I felt his words express something of my own experience, but he says it much better the I can!

.... "Mission has now moved to seeing that the gospel meets the real need of communities rather than from having huge and fancy church halls.

Llanfair Uniting Church in Penrhys is a perfect example of what it means to do mission from the marginalised to and for the marginalised. Despite how hard and costly it is to run the children's library, the cafe, the homework club and the laundry service, the church continues to strive seeing to it that these services are provided to the community. Another perfect example that has taken the mission of Christ at heart is St David's Uniting Church in Pontypridd which is helping a lot of refugees from southern Sudan, Eritrea and Syria and the homeless citizens to find shelter. It is wonderful that the two churches, in offering their support and help, are not selective - it does not matter what your creed is, your religious affiliation or your nationality.

To some individuals, mission is about proselytising their faith and converting others. They are not concerned about social needs, which is very far from what true mission is and should be. These two weeks I have worked in Llanfair and Said Davi's with volunteers such as Sharon, Rebecca from India and Miara from Madagascar in Penrhys as well as the Rev Phil Wall and Beverley Humphreys from BBC Wales in Pontypridd who are doing great work. I have reviewed that doing the mission of Christ is about showing the love and care of Christ.

Helping a person should never come with any ulterior motives but should be motivated by wanting to share God's love. The mission of God is simply choosing to become friends with people of other cultures and faiths. Mission is to strive for a just world; it is choosing to be a voice to the marginalised and the poor and above all telling the good news of Jesus Christ that needed no words or preaching and with no intentions of converting anyone to Christian faith by force or manipulation. Therefore, what should motivate the church today is not the promotion of our denominational differences rather how the Churches can choose to see to it that the kingdom of God is realised in people's lives through its mission of justice, compassion, solidarity and peace. "

Amen to that!
