From our Minister

Not quite a sparkly new year, but the year is still young! And this seems a good time to introduce some of the fresh resources, which are available to us ...



How can we grow and develop as disciples of Christ? Where can we find ways to help us grow in faith and live our faith? In being part of a faith community, worship, prayer, reading, being active in our wider community – these are integral to Christian life.

To help us in our walk of faith along the way of Jesus, the United Reformed Church has also been putting together resources for use by individuals and churches, under the general umbrella title '**Walking the Way**.'

When you look up Walking the Way, you may well see images of feet! This reminds us that we are all on a pilgrimage of faith, we are always learning, and there is an exciting journey ahead of us. However long or short our life as Christians so far, we too are disciples, like the people who followed Jesus long ago. That word 'disciple' means, 'someone who is learning'. And to recognise that we can keep learning all through our lives, is an exciting prospect.

Walking the Way is not a programme to follow, but an assembly of resources to help people to follow Jesus and to keep growing and thinking and doing. The resources are not contained in one book, but are also growing and changing, and there are all kinds of ways to get access to them – e mail, websites, social media and books.

There are things written in house by people in the United Reformed Church, there are things prepared collaboratively and ecumenically with people from many varied Christian traditions. And there are guides or directories on-line, to many other resources which might help us individually or in a church at a particular time.

The following chart below shows the resources which are there for us to use.

Walking the Way' includes ...

'Daily Devotions'

This comprises a short reading from the Bible, a reflection and prayer, a concise and neat way to spend a little time with God. The Daily Devotions are written by ministers, elders, students, teachers, members, in the URC.

They can be delivered by e mail, text or accessed by Facebook.

It is easy to sign up. Daily Devotions have already proved very popular and are seen beyond our denomination.

'Holy Habits'

These are 12 booklets packed with practical ideas. The idea is that there are "holy habits" which we can encourage and practise. Holy here means whole, healthy, not holier-than-thou !

The habits are drawn from the life example of believers in the early church we read about in the Acts of the Apostles:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs

were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved. (Acts 2. 42-47)

The booklets cover:

Biblical Teaching, Serving, Fellowship, Eating Together, Breaking Bread, Gladness & Generosity, Prayer, Worship, Sharing Resources, Making More Disciples

Some churches have started to look at and develop one 'habit', one aspect of Christian life, at a time, over the course of a few months. They are helpful guides to read and dip into for fresh ideas. (The materials were first envisaged in the Birmingham Methodist Circuit, but have been developed with contributions from other denominations including the URC.)

### **URC Website – resources for worship**

Online if you do a search for URC Walking the Way, you will find all sorts of ideas and liturgies and prayers for planning services of worship, and other events as well. Some of these resources come from the different Synods of the URC, some from the team of people who are guiding Walking the Way. You can simply start by finding the URC website: *urc.org.uk* 

#### 'Stepwise'

Stepwise offers more formal learning. Stepwise is the replacement for TLS (Training for Learning and Serving which has run for some decades). Individuals from different churches can meet together for more formal study and learning and practical activities. For local leaders, lay preachers, elders, or anyone who would like to learn with others – Stepwise offers a chance to meet people from other churches. It isn't only for people who feel a vocation to some form of leadership. The Synod Training & Development Officer for South Wales, Revd. Gareth Dyer, will be pleased to get Stepwise starting in our areas.

🕺 An Elder Writes … St Valentine was reputed to be a Roman priest martyred during the reign of Claudius. He was arrested and imprisoned for being caught marrying Christian couples and b otherwise aiding Christians who were at the time being persecuted by Claudius in Rome. The origins of Valentine's 🎔 Day are murky. We do know that the ancient Romans (💙 celebrated the feast of Lupercalia, a spring festival, on the 15th of February. With the introduction of Christianity, the holiday moved to the 14th of February--the saint's day that celebrated several early Christian martyrs named Valentine. St Dwynwen's Day was celebrated in Wales on 25 January. St Dwynwen is the Welsh patron saint of lovers, which makes her the Welsh equivalent of St Valentine. "What does the Bible say about love?" 🎔 The Bible has a great deal to say about love. In fact, the (Pible says that "love is of God" and "God is love" (1 John 4:7–8); in other words, love is a main characteristic of who God is. Everything God does is driven and influenced by His love. The Bible gives many examples of love: the caring provision of **Boaz for Ruth**; the deep friendship of **David** and Jonathan; the poetic, passionate love of Solomon and the Shulamite; the enduring commitment of Hosea to Gomer; the fatherly love of Paul for Timothy and John for 🎔 the church; and, of course, the sacrificial, saving love of 🎈

Christ for all believers.

<u>1 Corinthians 13</u>. Here, love's characteristics are listed:
 love is patient and kind; love doesn't envy, boast, or
 dishonor others; love is not proud or self-seeking; love is
 not easily angered, doesn't keep a record of wrongs, and
 doesn't delight in evil; rather, love rejoices with the truth;
 love always protects, trusts, hopes, and perseveres; love
 never fails (<u>1 Corinthians 13:4–8</u>). Of the greatest of God's
 gifts, faith, hope, and love, "the greatest ... is love" (verse

The Bible says that God was motivated by love to save the world (John 3:16). God's love is best seen in the sacrifice of Christ on our behalf (<u>1 John 4:9</u>). And God's love does not require us to be "worthy" to receive it; His love is truly benevolent and gracious: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, "Christ died for us". The Bible says that nothing can separate the believer from the love of God in Christ. God's love does not wax and wane; it is not a fickle, emotional sensation. God's love for those who trust in Christ is why He holds them in His hand and promises never to let them go.

February 2019 Report

Review of recent events:

December 2018: The two Christmas Concerts held at VAN-guard were excellent. The Caerphilly Community Chorus Concert on 15th December was most enjoyable, with a good size audience despite the atrocious weather. The following afternoon Cantare at Christmas performed to a large audience. David Fortey was unable to perform due to a very heavy cold. However, his colleague, Steffan Hughes from 'Only Men Aloud' replaced him last minute and joined Angharad and Ryan. It was a wonderful celebration of Christmas music in English and Welsh and Steffan received a warm VAN-guard Centre welcome. We hope that they will **all** return to perform for us sometime this year.

Earlier in the month on 6th December a 'Business in the Community Conference' was held at VAN-guard. Its aim was to introduce business people to local voluntary organisations. It was a considerable amount of work to arrange, but a worthwhile exercise, which brought new people into the building. Comments received have been very good and there were many comments about the beautiful venue and the warm welcome given to participants. Business in the Community had been instrumental in providing the church with considerable assistance when we first began on the road to restoration. It was good to meet up with some of their officers once again. **2019 groups update:** Regular weekly and monthly groups have resumed after the break. The only group on a delayed start is the Wednesday Drawing Class. The tutor, Jenny John, sustained a broken ankle just before Christmas and will not be able to start her classes before Mid/late February.

Many of the groups have increased their numbers which is good news, viz. Goldies Cymru, University of the Third Age, The Clarinet and Flutes Musicians' Group, the VAN-guard Art Group. Other private bookings include choral rehearsals and recording sessions.

This year the Caerphilly Community Chorus celebrates its 10th Anniversary and will hold a celebratory concert at VAN -guard on 5th July. However, the Choir will also be looking at appoint a new Musical Director for the autumn because Rosie Howarth will be finishing at the end of July.

Daniel is a very talented young musician who accompanied soloist performances here last year. He is also a composer and Conductor of the Choir at St. Margaret's Church in Blackwood. John and I have had the privilege of attending a couple of concerts at the church, which were arranged by Daniel, and at which he performed. He has promised to provide a varied programme of music for us to enjoy. This concert will be an excellent start to the new concert series. Advance notice:

Future events:

Concerts of a varied nature have been arranged every month until June as well as the Community Chorus' Christmas 2019 Concert and there are still concerts to be fitted in to the calendar. We have done our best to allow for sufficient time between events in this year's programme and hope for continued support from the church membership.
