Many thanks for all the donations to the Caerphilly Foodbank over the years. Currently it is open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10am to 1pm. The hours have been extended as the need has increased.

There is the opportunity to donate every Sunday in the crate at the back of the church, however, if past Harvest services are to go by, there will be a very generous amount of food on 20th October.

There is a need for a wide variety of food and we particularly run short of such items as tinned fruit, rice pudding, juices / squashes and UHT milk.

What we don't need at the moment is tinned beans or pasta or tea—there are plenty of these on the shelves as people have been very generous.

Although the groceries supplied to clients are basic, when possible, we also add 'extras' that have been donated, such as boxed cakes, sweets, chocolate, toiletries and toilet rolls.

Recently, Glanmor's has been supplying bread not sold the previous day, which is very helpful.

Monetary donations are also welcome to purchase groceries that are running low.





 sadly performed to a small but appreciative audience.


Wednesday 25th September at 4.00 p.m. Tickets £7.00 'Concert and Cake'
