#### An Elder writes ...

#### "What is the meaning of Lent?"

Lent is a period of fasting, moderation, and self-denial traditionally observed by many Christians. It begins with <u>Ash Wednesday</u> and ends with <u>Easter Sunday</u>. The length of the Lenten fast was established in the 4th century as 46 days (40 days, not counting Sundays). During Lent, participants eat sparingly or give up a particular food or habit. It's not uncommon for people to give up chocolate and or biscuits during Lent. It's six weeks of self-discipline.

The 40 days of **Lent** represent the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness at the start of His ministry. Jesus fasted during His time in the wilderness, and so Christians identify with His suffering by abstaining from particular foods during this time.

Rather than the usual attempts to give up personal favourites such as chocolate, this Lent why not try "eco fasting", which can benefit both the environment and some of the most disadvantaged people in our world.



#### Below are some examples:

- Eat less meat and more fruit and vegetables ...
- Go zero-waste or plastic-free. ...
- -Reduce food waste. ...
- -Cook from scratch for all of Lent. ...
- -Buy Fair Trade items. ...
- -"Fast" from excess water use. ...
- -Try a buy-nothing challenge. ... " Say do I really need this?".....
- -Do a digital detox i.e. mobile phone turned off for periods of time.....
- -Use public transport more often.....

So why not use this Lent as well as a preparation for Easter, to make your lifestyle greener, to shrink your carbon footprint? Or use it to focus on improving your wellbeing and health in other ways, such as a digital detox.

These courses are free.


