Angels What do we think about angels today?

Hebrews 12 v21-22 tells us that there are thousands and thousands of angels and just as they helped God's people in Biblical times, I believe they still help his people today.

We might not always be aware of their presence, often they are our companions. Without us knowing it; God's mighty angels are always nearby, ready to help.

Hundreds of stories document extraordinary divine interventions. The Reverend John G. Paton, a missionary told us about the night hostile natives intended to burn down the mission house with him and his wife inside. They both prayed all night for protection and in the morning the danger had passed. A year later the Reverend Paton met the chief of the natives and asked him what had stopped him burning down the mission house.. The chief answered by asking who were the big men in shining garments with swords surrounding the house. Only then did Rev Paton realise that God had sent his angels to protect him.

Corrie Ten Boom also wrote of her and her sister's $\sqrt{2}$ experience in Ravensbruck Nazi concentration camp. She $\sqrt{2}$ prayed for angels to cover them so that they were unseen $\sqrt{2}$ and so the guards let them pass without checking them.

Jesus is known by numerous titles and one of those is, 'Prince of Peace.'

The newspaper item concluded ...

'There are two words, one Arabic, one Hebrew, that share the same root. They both mean peace... Salaam and Shalom.' AMEN to that. Diane

It was with great sadness that we recently learned via the
 VAN-guard e mail list that Sir Simon Boyle had died. He
 had passed away on 4th September 2020 aged 79 years.

He was the Lord Lieutenant of Gwent when we first met him.
 In that capacity he visited the Church and the VAN-guard
 Centre to attend activities and events.

He and his wife attended the Rededication Service of the Church after the restoration of the worship area. He also participated with the un-veiling of the memorial plaque to the Rev. Edward Bush on the centenary of the first minister's death. On that occasion he was joined by Mrs. Linda Williams, the granddaughter of Rev. Edward Bush, and Mr. Paul Dennis, who designed and made the plaque which he gifted to the church. We have many photographs of both occasions.

Sir Simon also attended a good number of VAN-guard
concerts as well as performances by Cwmpas Theatre, of
which he was a Patron.

It was through him that John and I received the invitations to
 attend the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Service in Ebbw Vale
 and his farewell service as Lord Lieutenant of Gwent at St.
 Woolos Cathedral in Newport.

He was also the President of the Gwent Association of
 Voluntary Organisations (GAVO) of which both the Church
 and VAN-guard are members. We would therefore meet
 him at their Annual General Meetings and other events. We
 were always grateful for his interest and encouragement in


what we were doing both as a church and centre. We have written to Lady Boyle expressing the belated sympathy and condolences of both church and centre to her and the family.
