In John, "Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Who so ever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

In the Bible, light has always been a symbol of holiness, goodness, knowledge, wisdom, grace, hope, and God's revelation. By contrast, darkness has been associated with unhappiness, sin, and despair.

Christmas is a time of light; flickering candles, twinkling fairy lights glowing on our Christmas trees and spectacular festive displays in our streets and shopping centres. Caerphilly has its own "River of Light".

We have lived through almost two very difficult years. Let us hope that we can now take the Hand of God and walk in the light during 2022.

I wish you all a peaceful and joyous Christmas and new year.
