HOSPITAL PATIENT ASKED TO COOK FOR MEDICS

Mary Jones was astonished when doctors at Grimthorp General Hospital told her she was ready to be discharged but first would she pop into the hospital kitchens and cook meals for the tired and hungry staff on her ward

You may well think this is outrageous but....hold on. There is a very similar incident recounted in all three of the synoptic gospels.

After a long, tiring day teaching in a synagogue, Jesus with perhaps James and John went to Peter's house where they found the mother-in-law seriously ill in bed with a high fever. Jesus healed her and she immediately got up and proceeded to serve him with food. Oops!! There must be more to the story than this. Surely the gospel writers did not intend to imply that Jesus healed her simply because he needed her to cook for him. The problem is that the gospel accounts are written in a terse, deadpan fashion with not the slightest focus on the woman. She is not even named and is never mentioned again. I confess that I feel the writers failed by not emphasising that she ministered to Jesus. His human side did suffer tiredness and physical hunger and needed to be adequately fed.

What an important type of ministry this was and still is today. In so many churches worldwide there are people (mainly, but not exclusively, women) who provide drinks and snacks for worshippers, cook fellowship meals from time to time and apply themselves to tidying, cleaning, sweeping, polishing and dusting

to ensure that places of worship are sparkling and welcoming.

It happens that people come forward to thank priests and lay preachers for the Sunday worship and thank organists and pianists for the music provided. But how often do we fail to thank someone for the polished floor? For the dusted seating? For the hot drink on a cold Sunday?

Let's give a silent cheer for the splendid ministry of Peter's Mother-in-law and for all who follow in the same vein and deserve our thanks and admiration.

Let us take time over the summer to consider perhaps how we can engage with our communities and with other Christians.



(Ecclesiastes 10:1)

From Tubal-Cain mixing elements to make bronze in Genesis 4 to Lydia mixing fibres and snail shells, with perhaps a bit of madder root to make her purple cloth, the Bible is full of clever craftspeople messing and mixing the ingredients of God's creation in order to create ever more new composite materials for every kind of use you can think of. For better or for worse.

The quote above from Ecclesiastes 10:1 reflects on the truth that a small bit of foolishness can greatly overshadow any wisdom. So it is then, that in our wisdom we can split an atom and because of our foolishness we cause mass destruction. It is not only human beings who need rest, the whole of creation needs time out too. Lock downs changed many habits, including the desire to travel great distances for holidays. Why not try . . .


