Like her grandmother Teresa was able to hold the christening bowl that Edward used to christen some of his children. John prepared a display of documents relevant to the early beginnings of this church and its construction. They knew some of the story of Edward Bush from the book written by his granddaughter Linda Williams, with whom we remain in contact. They spent two hours looking around, taking photographs, and asking many questions. We were pleased to give them a centenary mug of the church, a photograph of Edward Bush and a photograph of Linda Williams, the then Lord Lieutenant of Gwent, Sir Simon Boyle, and Paul Dennis, who designed and donated the memorial of Edward Bush to the church.
