A Change of Perspective.

In Windhoek the capitol of Namibia, we visited a Lutheran church which was built in 1907. It was interesting how different the architecture was from Van Rd, despite them being of the same era.

This Church had very beautiful stained glass windows along the side and at the front. Apparently, the windows had to be made in Germany and transported to Windhoek as there was no manufacturing ability locally at the time. Unfortunately, the first set of windows arrived broken and damaged. After a legal battle the manufacturer was ordered to make new ones. There was initial concern when these windows were delivered because there had been a fire on the train, but fortunately the fire damage only affected the casing the windows were carried in. For 76 years the windows were admired by everyone until one day a tourist 'in the know' pointed out that they had been put in the wrong way round - the outward facing glass should have been facing in! What a shock this was. The Church decided to bring in an expert to change them all, turning each piece of glass individually.

Although the congregations over the years had loved the windows, they could look at them now in a new light, have a greater appreciation of them.

When we take time to try to take a new perspective on the familiar, then we might also see things in a new light.

STATEMENT FROM CHRISTIAN AID REGARDING THE HOSTILITIES IN ISRAEL AND GAZA.

'Thousands of people have been killed and over a million displaced after the escalation of violence in Israel and the occupied Palestinian territory.

In Gaza a humanitarian crisis is unfolding. 3,800 Palestinians have been killed and 12,500 injured. Over 1 million have been displaced from their homes; supplies of water and food are fast running out.

We're urging all parties to abide by international law to protect innocent civilians and agree to an immediate de-escalation of this unprecedented violence.

"We didn't sleep last night. We are so scared. Many people have been killed. Some of our staff are evacuating and some of them have lost their houses already. We've not had any electricity for more than 24 hours."

Church Finances

Each year the United Reformed Church sets a budget for contributions to its Ministry and Mission (M&M) Fund. You will remember that the M&M is a family affair, where all members of the family work to support our Ministers and Church Related Community workers across the United Reformed Church, no matter where we are. This budget is then delegated down to local Churches through the Synods who suggest a target for each local Church.

Our target for 2024, set at £12276, was agreed by the Elders in its our October meeting. It is £2000 less than our contribution in 2023 and is based on a calculation of £486 per member. This is just one part of our outgoings (keeping the Church warm and insured and maintained are other costs we incur). However, as with the wider Church, we recognise our local Church is a family and we give based on our ability to pay in response to God's generous grace.
