An Elder Writes

We are entering the magical seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany as we honour the baby whom Isaiah described as the Prince of Peace. But, yet again, we are witnessing a world which is far from peaceful. It is easy to signal good intentions by calling for peace wherever there is conflict but history, including that recorded in the Old Testament, shows us that unless both sides in that conflict yearn for , there will be no peace with honour and justice.

President Zelensky has insisted that calls for a ceasefire and talks with the Russian invaders would mean, in reality, Ukraine's surrender and the subjugation of the Ukraine nation. Had Churchill in 1940 agreed a ceasefire and peace talks who can doubt that the whole of Europe and Britain would have ended up under the rule of Hitler's evil regime?

I have no doubt that life is a battle between good and evil which regularly and disastrously results in wars between nations. Like you, I do not control the levers of power and do not take military decisions. However, all of us face a battle with demons that can enter our hearts and minds. Even the baby in the manger on reaching manhood had to battle in the wilderness against the temptations of the devil and there was to be no surrender to evil.

His ministry was opposed by corrupt Jewish Church leaders who were an impediment to the proper worship of God. Again, there was to be no surrender to the ungodly principles of those whom Jesus labelled as hypocrites.



We always face this struggle between Godliness and Sin. I know that if I am guilty of any of the seven deadly sins (pride, greed, wrath, envy, lust, gluttony and sloth) then I am only paying lip service to the baby in the manger when really my thoughts and actions are contrary to God's will. I may delude myself that I am at peace but this is peace with dishonour.

May I wish all of us a happy and peaceful Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. With God's gracious love to protect us from temptation may we truly find peace with honour as we honour the baby in the manger.

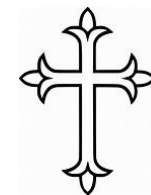

General Assembly Resolutions

As I mentioned in Church Meeting, there were a number of resolutions that were approved at this year's General Assembly of the United Reformed Church that local Churches should be aware of. Here is a summary of the resolutions:

The Synod Moderators Report

The Synod Moderators Report raised a number of questions for local Churches to consider as they reflected on 50 years of the United Reformed Church, both reflecting on our relationship with the wider Church and also looking at being Church moving forward. We may take up some of these questions in a future Cafe Church.

The Communication Strategy

In response to the resolutions on a Communication Strategy we agreed in Church Meeting to order 2 copies of the Reform magazine each month and make them available for people to read.

Poverty and Inequality in the UK

General Assembly was concerned at the many significant changes in the nature and extent of inequality in Britain over the last decade, e.g. through austerity, Covid-19 and the recent cost of living crisis. A resolution that expressed concern, and called on political leaders to work to eradicate structural poverty in the UK and challenged the Church to reflect on how it could better demonstrate its commitment to people experiencing poverty and marginalisation was agreed.

Illegal Migration

General Assembly expressed deep concerns about the Illegal Migration Bill and In response invited churches and members of the URC to write to their MPs and prospective Parliamentary candidates expressing their opposition to the Bill and urging them to support the development of safe and legal routes for those seeking asylum.

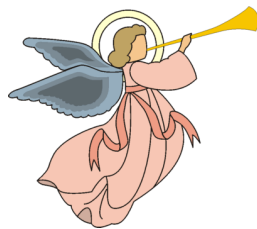
