She enjoyed crafts, particularly crocheting - many were privileged to be given one of her crochet lavender bags.

She enjoyed baking - cakes, tarts, delicious Christmas puddings, Simmel cake and sherry trifle.

Veronica loved poetry and could quote many a line from a wide range of verse. Over the years she wrote down her reflections on life - many of her articles were included in her church magazine.

Veronica grasped any opportunity to dress up. You should have seen her as a chimney sweep, for example and she made a very unusual Father Christmas.

Veronica had an amazing memory - remembering people, places and incidents vividly.

She had many words of wisdom. For example,

-'Procrastination is the thief of time,'

'You've got to have a sense of humour to get by,' but, 'Live for Today!' was her mantra.

Veronica had a great faith and regularly attended Christchurch and in the past took the opportunity to join ecumenical Bible study groups. She was at the foundation of Christchurch.

She was generous in every way. She gave to numerous charities and often gave pocket money to her grateful grandchildren and great grandchildren with advice-

'Save a little, Spend a little, Put a little by!'

During the war years, Veronica was a telephonist, vital work

in challenging times.

Veronica was very proud of her family. She declared that what got her through sad or challenging times was, 'Family, Friendship and Faith.'

Most of all ,Veronica was love. Love for John, her husband and for all her family and friends.

She had a long and fruitful and meaningful life.

She is a legend!

She will be greatly missed.


