Candlemas Day February 2nd

Called Candlemas because of the custom of lighting the candles during the festival. Today commemorates the day in the year 1 when Mary went to be purified at the Temple of Jerusalem 40 days after the birth of Jesus and to present him to God as is described in the 2nd chapter of Luke.

The earliest record of Candlemas comes from 4th century Jerusalem when it was celebrated on 14th February, 40 days after the eve of Epiphany Emperor Justinian set Candlemas on 2nd February, 40 days after Christmas Eve., but the holiday was celebrated only in Justinian's eastern empire.

In 7th century, Pope Sergius I introduced Candlemas to his catholic subjects in Rome and over the centuries it made its way across Europe and into Great Britain. There small children celebrated with this song ..,

'If Candlemas be fair and bright Come, Winter, have another flight; If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, Go, Winter and not come again.'
